2018 Haiti Missions Trip

Students Who Completed 11th-12th Grade (Students Who Completed 10th Grade Will Be Considered if Slots are Available): Poverty Resolutions Trip to Haiti

Dates: June 17-23

What will the team be doing? *Potential Service Areas:*

- Construction projects
- Orphan care
- Children's programs/Bible school/sports
- Agriculture (greenhouses/tree planting/tilapia farm maintenance/chicken tending)
- English language training
- Community building

Safety: The safety of our students is extremely important to us. An American or Haitian representative of Poverty Resolutions assists all groups and is available to answer questions or aid with translation. There is always a security guard at the team's accommodations (Kaliko Beach Club). Additional security at project sites will be available as needed. One representative from Poverty Resolutions will be present with everyone from the group throughout the trip.

What does the cost include?

- Airfare and lodging
- 3 meals/day
- Ground transportation in Haiti
- Translators
- Travelers insurance

Cost: \$1750 (\$150 deposit from the student and the rest will be raised)

- Funds will be raised through:
 - Personal support letters
 - Auction and luncheon

*Families will need to expect to pay for vaccinations, immunizations and a passport on top of the base cost. Vaccination costs will vary depending on your insurance provider.
