

CFC On-Site Protocols

September 2020 update

Since May 24th we have opened CFC for on-site worship services. The rationale behind doing so is straightforward: churches are essential services in our state and gathering with the body of Christ is important when it is physically possible (Heb. 10:24–25). However, we also are mindful of the recommendations for taking precautionary measures, which include limiting seating capacity to 50%.

We would love for you to come to church if you feel comfortable doing so and are not sick. We recommend that face masks or face shields be worn in public spaces until you are seated in a socially spaced location in the sanctuary or other room. We ask that everyone refrain from congregating in narrow & high traffic areas inside. Note: we have free disposable face masks available at the front and back entrances (ask a security team member for one). We encourage you to fellowship & congregate outside after services when possible and in the gym & other large rooms (Fellowship Hall & Adult Learning Center) when the weather does not allow this.

All pastoral staff, on duty deacons, greeters, security team and ushers are required to wear a face mask while they are serving people in public areas on a given Sunday. In addition, we have implemented the following measures in an attempt to keep the church a safe place to be:

1. If you are sick or have a compromised immune system, please remain home and participate through one of our online venues (live streaming via YouTube or Zoom).
2. When you arrive, the security team will open all external doors for your convenience and safety.
3. Sanitizer is provided at all entrances. Please use as you enter and exit.
4. Offering boxes are also provided at each entrance. Please place your offering in the box *before* the church service if possible. If you are a guest, your presence is your offering!
5. The ushers will open and close the Sanctuary doors for your convenience and safety.
6. In the sanctuary, pews available for use are marked with green tape to allow for appropriate distancing. If you have any uncertainty about where to sit, the ushers will assist you.
